1. THE FIRST PART OF THIS 'MYSTERY'

- "we shall not all <u>sleep</u>"
- Explanation of this "sleep"

OBSERVE: If <u>death</u> is meant, why is it called "sleep"?

- The believer's death is like a sleep:
 - (i) nothing to fear in it
 - (ii) a rest from the toils of this life

APPLICATION: We may fear; but such are ignorant fears

2. THE SECOND PART OF THIS "MYSTERY"

- "we shall all be <u>changed</u>"
- this change will affect two classes of Christians:
 - (i) the living
 - (ii) the dead
- The <u>Nature of this change</u>: v.53
 - (i) <u>corruptible</u> bodies altered for ever
 - (ii) mortal bodies immortalised

APPLICATION: This is <u>the</u> problem of the ages which no philosopher could solve: DEATH. Now it <u>is</u> solved by Christ through the gospel.

<u>ILLUSTRATION</u>: a handsome man/woman in their prime – not so in old age. But...

3. THE TIME IT WILL TAKE FOR THIS "CHANGE"

• a "moment" ("atom"); "twinkling"

<u>ILLUSTRATION</u>: one tick of clock / one blink <u>DOCTRINE</u>: God's glorious power does all this in one

split-second.

ILLUSTRATION: Christ's transfiguration

4. THE TIME WHEN THIS CHANGE WILL OCCUR

- "at the <u>last trump</u>" (v.52) = "trumpet" so called because:
 - (i) the <u>O.T.</u> refers to trumpets for <u>various</u> uses (See Numbers 10:1-10)
 - (ii) but this is the <u>last time</u> in history (See 1 Thes. 4:16-17)
 <u>OBSERVE</u>: <u>History</u> will end with the blast of God's trumpet: "Time is over: History is finished!"
 <u>APPLICATION</u>: We should remind ourselves often of this great event. It is a comfort to the believer in old age when our strength fails.

5. WHAT ARE WE TOLD FURTHER ABOUT THIS GREAT CHANGE TO A CHRISTIAN'S BODY?

Paul has spoken of <u>4 wonderful improvements</u> to the body at the last day: v.42-44

- (i) "sown in corruption <u>incorruption</u>"
- (ii) "sown in dishonour glory"
- (iii) "sown in weakness <u>power</u>"
- (iv) "a natural body <u>a spiritual body</u>"

OBSERVE: The same body, but more beautiful and perfectly suited to heaven.

<u>ILLUSTRATION</u>: the cycle of the butterfly

6. HOW DOES PAUL FURTHER EXPLAIN THIS?

By the illustration of a seed: v.37-38

ILLUSTRATION: a packet of flower seeds / acorn / sycamore.

What does this illustration show us?

- (i) the resurrection body will come from our present earthly body:
- (ii) it will be different in appearance

7. <u>CAN WE BE SURE THE RESURRECTION BODY WILL BE</u> DIFFERENT?

See v.35-38. The appearance will be quite different, surely:

- (i) the <u>present body</u> is suited to life on earth but not to heaven
- (ii) the <u>resurrection body</u> will be suited to heaven <u>ILLUSTRATION</u>: the grub and the butterfly. God, surely, has given this as a perfect illustration.

8. ALL THIS IS ORDERED MOST WISELY BY GOD

- 1) Adam was earthly: Christ heavenly
- 2) Adam's children are earthly: Christ's people will be heavenly See v. 45-49

ILLUSTRATION: an astronaut has a space-suit

9. ALL THIS IS SAID TO MAKE US TRIUMPHANT

See v.54-57. "Victory"! This is a victory over every enemy:

- (i) sin
- (ii) Satan
- (iii) death
- (iv) sorrow

CONCLUSION
