"CHRIST MADE SIN FOR SINNERS"

Introduction

- 1. We refer to this as the Action Sermon
- 2. It should always be on the Cross
- 3. This text is centred on the <u>Cross</u> Outline: 4 divisions

1. CHRIST WAS SINLESS

- 1) "knew no sin": Christ, the Son of God
- 2) Christ knew no sin:
 - (i) at His birth: the Virgin-Birth necessary
 - (ii) in childhood: we see a perfect child
 - (iii) at ordination: "all righteousness..."
 - (iv) in ministry: "which of you...?"
 - (v) at end of life: "I have glorified thee"
- 3) Yet Christ <u>exposed</u> to all evil:
 - (i) devilish temptations
 - (ii) cruel men's provocations
 - (iii) "tempted in all points..."

OBSERVE: The ONLY SINLESS MAN (The Second Adam)

2. CHRIST, THOUGH SINLESS, WAS MADE SIN

- 1) Be <u>clear</u> of these things:
 - (i) He was made, not "a sinner", but "sin". Explain.
 - (ii) It was not <u>men</u>, nor any action of His <u>own</u> by Christ, but <u>God</u> who did this.
 - (iii) Not "sinful" but "sin"
- 2) How God did this:
 - (i) by imputation

- (ii) a <u>transfer</u> of guilt + liability to punishment OBSERVE: all Christ's life He was under imputation
- 3) The immense <u>implications</u> of this:
 - (i) God was obliged to punish him
 - (ii) <u>all</u> the sins of all His people were on Him
 - (iii) Christ never "hated" Christ but loved Him, even while smiting Him.

APPLICATION: He is our <u>peace</u>; we were His <u>curse</u>

3. SINNERS ARE MADE RIGHTEOUS IN CHRIST

- 1) Adam had "original <u>righteousness</u>". Lost.
- 2) We all, in Adam, <u>lost</u> it also.
- 3) The wondrous <u>blessing</u> to us in Christ
 - (i) we become "the righteousness of God"
 - (ii) by counter-imputation
- 4) What does this involve?
 - (i) He has borne the penalty of all sin
 - (ii) There is no sin can <u>condemn</u> believers Cp. chastisement is not penal
 - (iii) The whole <u>righteousness</u> of Christ is ours by imputation <u>OBSERVE</u>: We are better off now than in Adam <u>APPLICATION</u>: To see this transaction is to have <u>peace</u>

4. THIS DIVINE METHOD OF SALVATION TELLS US VERY MUCH ABOUT GOD

- 1) It shows us how wise God is: "The foolishness of God..."
- 2) It shows us the justice of God: "He spare not his own Son"
- 3) It shows us the <u>love</u> of God: "Behold, what manner of <u>love</u>" **APPLICATION**
 - (i) Reflect much on what you deserve.
 - (ii) See what a <u>price</u> was paid for you

- (iii) Respect <u>all</u> your blood-bought <u>brothers</u>(iv) Look forward to the <u>reward</u> which Christ has purchased for you.
